## PASTOR'S COLUMN

Grace, mercy and peace to you all, in the name of Jesus! Amen.

So, none of us really thought we'd still be \*here\* (that is, under social distancing, wearing masks, and limited in the activities we could do outside our homes or "family bubbles") now. This was supposed to blow over so we could get back to the pre-COVID days quickly and without fear or fuss.

But, obviously, that is not how things have gone. There are debates that could be had about that – but this is not the place for those debates.

Here, in the church, what we continue to be called to is to live out the life we have in Christ – and to share His gifts with others as best we can. And it turns out we can do that in limited scope as well as expansively – that is, it is just as important that you be gracious and kind and patient with the small circle you currently live with as with folks from the larger circles you were connected to two months ago. We can still have devotions and be fed by the Word in our small groups as we were in the larger church setting. Here at Mt. Calvary, we've been trying to provide you, you family (and your friends!) with daily devotions and weekly "on line" worship opportunities. And, under the current guidelines, we are able to offer Holy Communion to small gatherings throughout the week (if the current offering of times doesn't work for you or

your household, please let us know so we can work out something better). One of the things I have come across in discussions about the situation the church faces in these times is that this is the "new normal," and that we are now the "church deployed" (as opposed to the church being holed up in our buildings).

We talked about this a little in Bible study last Sunday, and I wanted to get the point out for those of you who weren't there – as important as it is to realize that we are still "the church" regardless of the restrictions placed on us – and as important as it is to realize that Christ is still with us to give His gifts – *this is not normal, this is not how the church is called to be deployed.*

We were working through Chapter 2 of *The Acts of the Apostles* when we came to Luke's description of life in the post-Pentecost church at Jerusalem. Here it is:

*And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (Acts 2:42)*

Notice how "communal" all those activities are! We were created and called to live with each other, to come together, and to be built up together – not in isolation. Now, sometimes, because of health, social circumstances, or pandemics, we have to be separated for a time. But we need to understand that's not normal, nor does it give us the opportunity to do church "better." We are bearing the burden of these times – and it is hard. Christ will bear us up. But what we need to look forward to and pray for earnestly, is a return to the life we are called to in Christ.

That is a life where we can sit together and work through, digest, reflect upon and seek better understanding of what the apostles teach. Remember, they are the witnesses of Christ – their testimony hands Him on to us. Their wisdom shows us what living in Christ looks like. What they were inspired to set forth shows us how to read the Old Testament with understanding. While Bible study on line is better than nothing, there really is no substitute for the give and take that goes on when we come together in person to hear and receive the Word.

We've talked about "fellowship" before – but we need to remember at this time that it is more than having coffee and donuts and spending a few minutes catching with each other. The fellowship that Christ (the Living Lord!) gives His Church is one in which we bear each other's burdens, share each other's joys, and support each other as we are able. That only happens when we come together and get to know each other as we worship and study and receive Christ's gifts together. That said, I continue to challenge you all to pick up your directories and phones, and call around to your brothers and sisters at Mt. Calvary to "check in" with them. While our current circumstance is not ideal, there would be an unexpected blessing if we actually were to come out of this with a larger circle of acquaintances at church. Because of the rhythm of our old schedule, we had essentially become three congregations with little blending between the three. Let us seek to break that down a bit – so we move toward being one congregation that just happens to worship across three services...

The "breaking of bread" Luke refers to is Holy Communion. If you caught the service from the Third Sunday of Easter this year (it's still up at our You Tube channel), you heard how the two disciples in Emmaus "recognized" Jesus in the breaking of the bread. The Church has always understood that we know Jesus and His resurrection in a wonderful and unique way as we eat His Body and drink His Blood in Holy Communion. The Lord comes to us with forgiveness and life – and He bonds us together as we share that meal together. We miss that when we aren't able to come together.

Finally, the "prayers" Luke refers to are the liturgical prayers of corporate worship. One of the things many mature Christians learn is that we are blessed when we gather together for prayer and worship – and sing our praises together, and confess together – for we each strengthen one another and are strengthened as our voices join together.

That's what the normal life of the church looks like.

Let us pray that we are able to return to that soon. In the meantime, take advantage of opportunities to "connect" with us – and plan to come back as soon as you can!



click on our logo – subscribe to have new content shared with you automatically.

4. **Abbreviated Sunday services** are available at both Facebook and YouTube. These are pre-recorded (the live streaming just didn't work), and will generally be available by early Sunday morning.
5. **Worship has returned** – but under Illinois' current "Phase 3" guidelines, meaning that we can't have more than 10 people together at a time. We will be sending out weekly opportunities to sign up for a "communion seating" at pre-arranged times through Sign-Up Genius. If you don't have access to the internet, call the office and Judy will sign you up. You may also simply schedule individual appointments for communion.
6. **Bible Studies** -- "Zoom" is a site that allows video/voice conferencing, and we'll be using that to study God's Word together. And you can use it from home! Right now, Pastor Long is just doing Sunday morning (we're currently doing a read-through of the Acts of the Apostles to understand better how the Church carried on with the life of our resurrected Lord) and the Men's Bible Study (the Gospel According to St. Matthew). **Sunday will go for an hour starting at 10 am and the Men's Study will go for an hour as well, on Wednesday mornings at 6:30 am.** We'll send out e-mail invitations to all of you when a meeting is set up. Then follow the instructions to sign in. If we don't have an e-mail for you, please send us one we can use.
7. **Challenge:** As we are away from one another, we can still be "church," even if in a different way. One of the things St. Paul commends to us as the "body of Christ" is to share each other's joys and burdens. Turns out, you can do that by phone, even with someone you don't "know" all that well. So, I urge you all to join me (if you can) in "calling around the congregation" to check in on each other, get to know each other and encourage each other. Lost your directory? Judy will send you a new one.

8. **Illinois Phase 3:** As most of you have heard, Gov. Pritzker moved all regions of the state to "Phase 3" of his "re-opening" plan. Unfortunately, the current language of that plan does not allow us to move past the "10 people in the building" limit. There is pressure on his office to loosen restrictions on churches, but there is nothing official yet. Hence, we will abide by the current policy, and let you know when things change.
9. **Watch for news** on restarting the Wednesday evening and Thursday afternoon Bible studies!
10. **Stewardship during COVID-19:** While God has blessed us with a "cushion" financially during these odd days, the ministries of Mt. Calvary still need your support – whether it's Judy taking care of the office, Pastor Long trying to provide study and worship opportunities, the Pantry continuing to reach out to our area, or Mr. Tagge providing music. So please, prayerfully continue to send in your contributions.
