Pastor's Column

Come, Holy Spirit!

So, with Pentecost upon us (this Sunday, May 28) we encounter the second great festival of the Christian Church. If our historical evidence is reliable, the first annual celebration of the early Christian Church was the sequence of Maundy Thursday - Good Friday - and Paschal (Easter) Sunday. And the remembrance of Pentecost became an annual event not too long after that.

So - what's the big deal about Pentecost? Well, it's not the Church's "birthday" as some imagine - the Church, as the gathering of all believers, existed going back to Adam and Eve. Mind you, there have been challenges along the way, but God has always sent His Spirit to men and women to sustain faith in Him, His Word, and His promises. So, if not the Church's birthday, then what?

Two images captivated the ancient Church. The first was how, on the Day of Pentecost, the Spirit, through the disciples in Jerusalem, began to undo the effects of Babel by the proclamation of the Gospel. You may remember that at Babel, fallen men and women, filled with pride and defiance, sought to "build their way to heaven" by erecting a great tower. Of

course, that would never have worked. However, to humble humanity, and to teach them to listen more carefully, God confounded the languages at Babel, and thus broke the unity of a sinful humanity that worked against God's plan for their salvation. Various peoples scattered across the globe according to their language-groups, and then remained divided.... And further divided according to ethnicity, nation, tribe, and so-on. But on the Day of Pentecost, as the Holy Spirit manifested Himself in the tongues of flame that rested on the disciples, all nations and tribes were brought back together - not in a common language, but by the preaching of the Gospel in all languages. All the visitors to Jerusalem that day heard the "mighty things of God" proclaimed (His saving work in Jesus) each in their own language. Once divided by sin, men and women were being united in the good news of their redemption. And this work of bringing back what was divided reaches its completion in heaven, where St. John the Apostle saw that great, white-robed army, past all counting, praising God and the Lamb - from "every nation, tribe, ethnos, and tongue" (Revelation 7). So, not only do we rejoice in the good news of salvation in Christ - but Pentecost reminds us that our common salvation in Christ is the one thing that will truly reunite a fragmented human community.

The second image that captivated the ancient Church was the anointing Jesus received by

the Spirit at His baptism, which He then poured out on us at Pentecost. Here was how they understood it: the Eternal Son took our humanity to Himself in His conception, birth, and public life. But that human nature was given the full dignity of bearing the Divine nature through the anointing with the Holy Spirit. In Jesus baptized, all humanity was given the ability to bear the Spirit. By His death and resurrection, Jesus took away our sin and guilt. And then, on Pentecost, He poured out on us the same Spirit He received in His humanity at His baptism, so that just He came down to us to share our nature, we might be raised to Him to share His life and glory. This is also why the ancients thought God chose the Day of Pentecost to do this – as it was the festival of the Old Testament that celebrated the “first fruits” of the grain harvest as the promise of the full harvest to come. Likewise, the Spirit is given us now, so that in faith we would know that the “full harvest” is coming for us too – in which we shall be made like Christ and grow up fully into Him Who is our Head.

And all this brings us to the daily work of the Spirit. The old Latin hymn, *Veni Creator Spiritus* is still in our hymnals. However, the paraphrases that have come to us don't capture the fullness of what we pray for in that hymn. Here's a more literal translation of a few of the original stanzas....

*O most blessed Light,
fill the inmost heart
of your faithful.*

*Without Your Spirit,
there is nothing in man,
nothing that is not harmful.*

*Cleanse that which is unclean,
water that which is dry,
heal that which is wounded.*

*Bend that which is inflexible,
fire that which is chilled,
correct what goes astray.*

We recognize that it is through the work of the Spirit, and not our own self-chosen initiatives, that healing, faith, hope, and wholeness come. In us, apart from the Spirit – as St. Paul would say, there is nothing good. But with the Spirit, and joined to Christ, we can expect to be refreshed, cleansed, healed, warmed, corrected – AND shaped.

As we come to Pentecost, rejoice that the Spirit is poured out upon you that you may be shaped, bent, and confirmed to the image of Christ. After all – what other life is there?

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATIONS

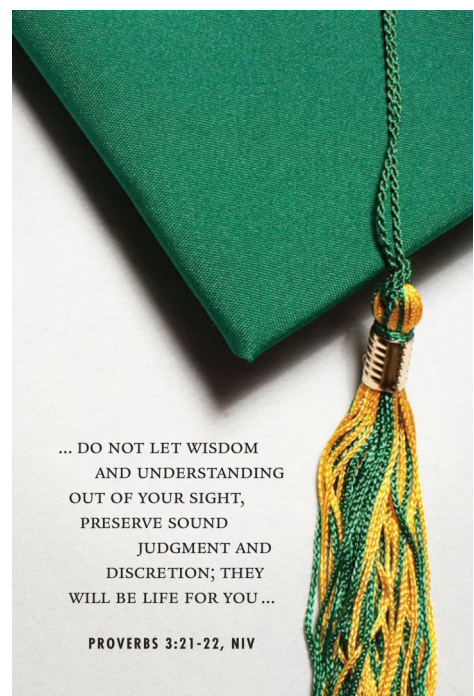
Frankie Brill, daughter of T. J. and Sara Brill, graduated from Richwoods High School.



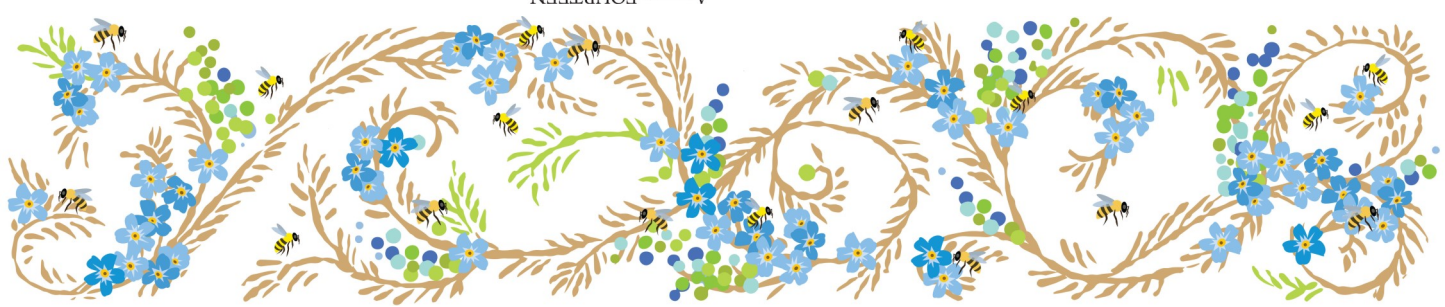

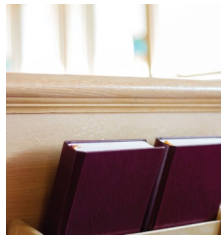
