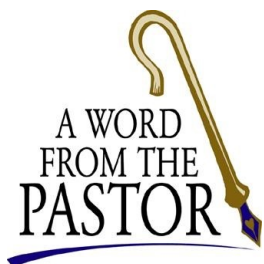

PASTOR'S COLUMN

"...but be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹ addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, ²⁰ giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ." Ephesians 5:18-21

So, our Thursday Bible Study just went through Colossians 3 this afternoon. And the discussion got me to thinking about one of the aspects of our life in Christ: how we learn to live with each other in faith. My thoughts here are influenced by a recent article in the Concordia Theological Quarterly (Volume 88, Number 1, January 2024) by Professor John G. Nordling, and Paul E, Deterding's Colossians Commentary (CPH, 2003).

Now, often we learn how to live with each other based on what is mutually satisfying. I learn how to live with my parents as I learn what makes them angry or happy, and they learn to live with me by the same process. This can extend to school, the workplace, government, and so on. In a sense, we're constantly making little contracts with each other in order to find a sense of satisfaction, or at least stay out of

trouble. The only problem with this is that it leaves us centered on ourselves - yeah, we want others to be satisfied too, but what's our primary concern? "Am *I* satisfied?" And when we put our satisfaction ahead of everything else, problems quickly arise - for what happens when my desire for satisfaction puts me at odds with another person as she or he pursues what is satisfying to them?

Paul, in his letters, sees Christians called to learn to live together differently. As you might guess, it starts with our identity in Christ. As a Christian is baptized, she or he "puts on Christ" (Galatians), and Christ comes to live in them (also Galatians). And with that reality, what is satisfying to me becomes secondary. What is primary is living out my identity in Christ by showing forth His image in me according to the various settings I am called to (home, church, work, school, and civic realm).

And that image is formed in me as I am formed by worship. Deterding argues that what Paul is thinking about when he refers to being "filled with the Spirit...", "making melody to the Lord in your heart...", and "giving thanks always..." is the gathered congregation in worship. Worship is where we are filled by the Holy Spirit as we hear God's Word and receive the sacraments. It is where we learn to sing hymns and psalms, making melody to the Lord. And it is where we learn to give thanks in all things. Worship is the center of our lives

in Christ – and as we are formed in Christ, it is with our brothers and sisters in the church that we learn to share Christ’s love and grace – learning patience, peace, humility, charity, and graciousness. And this is where “submitting to one another” comes in. I’ve referenced this before, but it bears repeating: submission in the Bible is not about giving in to the authority of another (unless that’s what is called for) – its primary concern is with you taking your proper place in relation to others as an expression of God’s good order.

Here's what I mean: in the Church, God has set apart some to be preachers and teachers, and other are given to listen to the Word and receive the gifts. None is better than the other – they just have different “callings” in that setting. Preachers “submit” to their hearers by study, teaching, encouraging, comforting, and so on. Hearers “submit” to their preachers by listening, supporting them, encouraging them, and praying for them. And as each seeks to serve the other, God’s order is reflected, and Christ’s virtues are shared in love and grace. And what is crucial here is that we learn to see Christ with and in each other. We’re all the baptized of Christ, which means we’re all called to learn how to treat each other as the beloved of the Lord. Notice, what satisfied me is no longer the central question – but what honors Christ and serves my neighbor is.

Paul brings this reality to bear on all our stations in life. Husbands and wives have a unique call in Christ to live out His love between them. And when they do that, the good order of marriage is set before the world. Parents and children have a unique call in Christ to live out His love between them. And when they do that, the good order of the family is set before the world. This even extends to employers and employees.

Both Professor Nordling and the Reverend Dr. Deterding believe that in a world and culture where so many institutions are abused and

distrusted – including marriage, the family, and the church – if we were to capture Paul’s exhortation to live our vocations with each other in love and grace, the Church could offer to the world at large a vision of good order that might give hope to those who have been hurt by the varied abuses of power and trust that typify life in a fallen world.

And it all starts with remembering who you are in Christ!

FAMILY FEAST

Serve protein-packed waffles for a family breakfast on FATHER’S DAY or any special occasion.

What you need:

- Adult help
- Waffle maker
- Blender
- 1 cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 6 eggs
- Cooking spray
- Diced strawberries
- Powdered sugar

What you do:

1. With adult help, preheat the waffle maker.
2. In the blender, add oats and cottage cheese. Crack eggs in a separate bowl, then add to the blender. Pulse to combine the mixture. Then blend on medium speed for 10 seconds.
3. Coat the waffle maker with cooking spray. Spoon about 1/3 cup batter onto the iron and close.
4. Carefully remove the waffle when it’s golden brown. Repeat with remaining batter.
5. Top with strawberries and powdered sugar. Makes about 6 waffles.

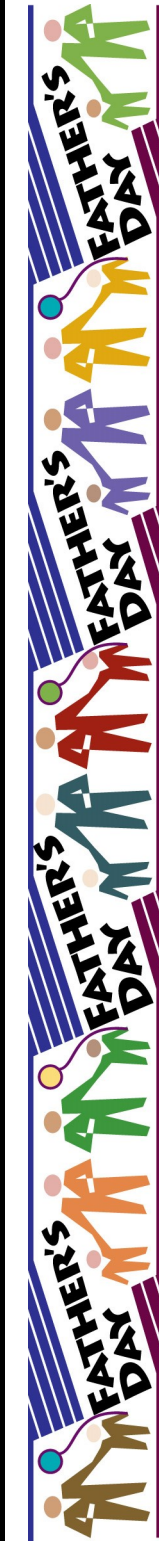
