

# Pastor's Column

Two brief thoughts to share with you this month: the first concerns the Labor Day holiday we are about to observe (or are observing as you read this); and the second concerns Christian education.

**Labor Day:** I wrote about this a few years back, but it never hurts to be reminded about the wonder of this reality in our lives. As some of you know, and even remember, Labor Day used to be more than the "end of summer" holiday that it has largely become today. I know that there are still a few communities that have parades, and that some of our local unions still organize picnics and time for politicians to share a few words. But for the most part, the "labor" part of Labor Day has faded into the background as folks get their last "vacation" in before that long wait until Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, or even Thanksgiving, comes around. School has started, and all the activities associated with that, and sports, and social activities, seem to fill the calendar all too quickly.

But what gets lost in this is the original notion that there was something important about recognizing the laborer, the worker, the men and women engaged in hard, and often thankless, toil that allows you and me to go about our daily lives. Now when the holiday was first observed, the "labor" that was celebrated was the kind that involved hard, sometimes dangerous, manual work – in factories, mills, mines, and so forth. And originally the holi-

day was also used to apply political pressure to make sure that wages were just, hours fair, and working conditions safe. All of these things are still issues, as we hear stories of the tragedies that occur when shortcuts are taken with work safety. As Christian citizens it is still proper and good for us to be concerned with seeing to it that just laws are passed to insure the safety and just treatment of all those who work.

Yet, I think as Christians, we can take a broader view of Labor Day as well. We can begin with thinking of all the people whose work we never see, but without whom we would be impoverished. We all know the obvious folks who serve us - whether first responders, in the medical field, in education, in service industries, or the market place. And then there are the garbage collectors, and there are the engineers who design products that we use every day, or who help make sure that the materials from which our products are made are safe. Of course there are farmers and ranchers and those in the dairy industry. There are janitors. There are folks who work in the utilities to produce the gas or electricity that we use - or who make sure that those vital resources make it to our homes. We can think of foresters who harvest the wood that we use in so many things. And this list can go on and on. Thousands - hundreds of thousands - of people whom we never see, whom we do not know all working with the result that we have food, clothing, home, and all that we can see and

name. The wonder of this for us is that we realize that it is finally God our loving Father Who is at work through all these people. He has ordained that He typically works through our work - ever since He set Adam and Eve in the garden to tend it. Could God do His works directly - and just make the food and supplies we need for the support of our bodies and life appear from out of nowhere? Yes, of course He could. But that is not how He has chosen to work. He has appointed that He uses our work to serve others. It is for that reason that Luther liked to refer to the work we do as "masks of God." For if God serves us through the work of others, then that also means that God serves others through our work. As we carry out our vocations, as we toil at jobs either menial or impressive, as we do that which helps others, God is working through us to provide for them. And this is what makes all legitimate labor noble and gracious. There is no job so humble that God is not there, and there is no job so grand that it can be accomplished without God. So on this Labor Day, consider how in His love and mercy, for Christ's sake, God provides for you through the work of others. And reflect also on how He uses you and your hands to provide for others through your work. And then give Him thanks for His grace that accepts us as co-workers with Him in faith, and which makes us fellow-servants to each other, called to give Him the glory.

**Christian Education:** This is another topic I have written about before, and so consider this a gentle reminder.

Christian education is absolutely necessary to the life of faith, and is necessary at all stages of our life in the Church. Now this education begins at home – when a Christian mother and father begin to teach their child about God, Jesus, prayer, and some of the fundamental stories of faith. It continues in worship as parents bring their child to the services of the Lord's house, and that child begins to learn how to worship with the congregation. Then often, the congregation will help parents with their teaching of their children through Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Confirmation classes, and similar enrichment programs. But notice that these all grow from the parental office.

When a believer reaches adulthood, then she or he needs to enroll in the congregation's adult education so that there can be growth in understanding and application of the Scriptures and the doctrines of the Church. Sometimes we even need to learn the same lessons over and over again so that they get a deeper grasp on us.

What this means for you is that you need to take advantage of Christian Education here at Mt. Calvary as you are able - and if nothing at present works for you, suggest that a class get organized that you can join. Parents, it really is important that you bring your children to Sunday School - or arrange for them to get a ride to Sunday School - especially if you don't get the chance to teach them basic Bible stories and prayers at home. You will also find that as you join in Bible study here, you are strengthened in your faith and understanding. Now, we have some great teachers in our program - but they need students! And for our Sunday School program to become more active we need all our families to participate as they are able.

So join us for Christian Education at Mt. Calvary.

And rejoice in the works God has given you to do.


