PASTOR'S COLUMN

"I have said these things to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." John 16:33

"Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation." Psalm 146:3

So, in case you hadn't noticed, we have a national election coming up in November. And, if you listen to the various "talking heads" out there - whether on the television, in podcasts, on the radio, on the internet, or in newspapers - you will be convinced that this election is a "make or break" deal for the nation - irrespective of which side you find yourself inclined toward. And what does all this ranting do? It produces a lot of anxiety, i.e. "what will happen if the other side wins?" It produces a lot of acrimony, e.g. "folks who support that candidate are idiots bent on destroying the country!" And, it makes it very hard to move on with the work on the day come November 6.

Do I need to point out that none of this is Christianly healthy? Fear and anxiety belong to the devil's bag of tricks. Acrimony is not what we are called to regarding our neighbor. And, our vocations, in family, in church, and in the civic sphere, will continue to need us no matter what happens on November 5th.

I believe a good deal of the excitement being stirred up as we come to election day comes from folks who have forgotten the eternal truths. After all, if you do not believe that there is a God Who is intimately involved in the ongoing care of the cosmos, then you can think it is up to you to set the world straight. And, if you think it is all on you, then obstacles that are in your way can seem like disasters waiting to happen. It can begin to seem that everything good hangs on the outcome of this vote or that, this ruling or that, this leader or that.

But we know that is not true. We have the God of creation, Who comes to us in Jesus born at Bethlehem, and Who gives us His Spirit to enlighten us by the Gospel, and build us up in faith, hope, and love. And for that reason, we can "take heart." The phrase Jesus used when speaking to the disciples in the upper room on the night when He was betrayed, means to be bold and confident even in the face of daunting circumstances. Why can we have such confidence? Because Christ has overcome the world. I know it doesn't often seem like that when we see the spiritual forces of wickedness

influencing the "high places" in this present dark age. But, again, do not let appearances deceive! Jesus has died, is risen, has ascended, and has promised that He will come again. There is no power in the cosmos that can oppose Him, and His order will prevail.

This doesn't mean that in the short term, everything will be butterflies and rainbows. There will be tribulation. Some of it will be a matter of the old world's hostility to Christ, and some of it will be the result of a sin-broken creation coming apart at the seams. It won't be easy. Much of it may be hard, distressing, and even heart-breaking. But we know Who has overcome all this. And He has overcome not by the brute force of His power to subdue all things - He has overcome by love, by sacrifice, and by grace. That's why He is the source of a life and salvation that no mere ruler of this world could ever bring forth.

And that's why we, as His Church, remain confident in the face of so much that seems contrary to light and true life. We have been given to gather with our Lord and God, to hear His Word, to be forgiven all our fears and failings, and to receive His Body and Blood to strengthen us for life.

So, let us pray for the nation, let us pray for those who do not know Christ and His love and mercy - that they would come to Him even as He calls to all, let us pray for our neighbors - and serve them in love, and let us live in peace. Be of good cheer. You know Who reigns on high, even now. To Him be the glory. Amen!

Make decorative stones as reminders of God's many great attributes.

What you need:

- Flat, smooth stones
- Printed, decorative napkins
- Paintbrush
- Clear-drying craft glue
- Scissors
- Permanent marker

What you do:

1. Unfold the napkin, carefully separating the printed side from the solid side.
2. Brush a thin layer of glue atop a stone. Lay the napkin (printed side up) on the glue and press down. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
3. Turn the stone over and paint more glue on the back. Wrap the napkin edges around the stone, trimming as needed. Paint more glue over the napkin. Let dry.
4. On the stone, write an attribute of God (loving, wise, powerful, merciful, etc.).
5. Repeat with more stones. Use them as gifts, paperweights, table decorations, etc.


