The Treasurer's Report for November 2024 (as approved at the December Voters' Meeting) showed the year's expenses at \$332,582.60 and income of \$336,590.70 which includes \$54,009.28 from the Endowment Fund to support Concordia and \$14,736.00 from Thrivent. them by the office.
