REGISTRATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

Members of Mt. Calvary and visitors, who are confirmed members in good standing of congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, are asked to announce attendance at Holy Communion by means of the registration cards in the pews. Non-member visitors and guests, who may desire to attend Holy communion, are asked to speak in person with the pastor before doing so. Those who desire a blessing, but choose not to commune, may come forward and simply cross their hands over their chest.

In accord with Holy Scripture, our church teaches that Holy Communion is open only to those who: (1) have been baptized in the name of the Triune God; Matt. 28:19, Acts 2:41-42; (2) are able to examine themselves both as to what this meal is and also its purpose; 1 Cor. 11:26-30; (3) have confessed and repented of their sins; 1 John 1:8-2:3; (4) believe that in, with, and under the bread and wine all communicants receive the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins: 1 Cor. 11:23-27, 1 Cor. 10:16, Matt. 26:26-28; and who (5) are united in belief in the same teaching: 1 Cor. 10:17, Rom. 16:18, 2 John 10-11, Matt. 28:20, Heb. 13:9.

Looking for extra help in focusing your thoughts for the Lord's Supper? "Christian Questions with Their Answers" was prepared by Luther to address just that. They can be found in your hymnal on pages 329-330. Review them if you get to church early, or during the offering, or if you are waiting to be invited forward.

²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵Whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show His righteousness at the present time, so that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

SERMON

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: Beloved in the Lord! Let us open our hearts, let us examine ourselves according to our calling in life and the Ten Commandments, let us confess our sins and pray for forgiveness in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

(Quiet as you examine your conscience)

P: Almighty God,

C: I CONFESS TO YOU THAT I AM A MISERABLE SINNER, GUILTY OF EVERY SIN, OF UNBELIEF, AND OF BLASPHEMY. I ALSO FEAR THAT YOUR WORD IS NOT BRINGING FORTH FRUIT IN ME, I HEAR IT, BUT I DO NOT RECEIVE IT EARNESTLY. I DO NOT SHOW WORKS OF LOVE TO MY NEIGHBOR. I AM FULL OF ANGER, HATE, AND ENVY TOWARD OTHERS. I AM IMPATIENT, GREEDY, AND BENT ON EVERY EVIL. THEREFORE, MY HEART AND CONSCIENCE ARE HEAVY AND I WOULD GLADLY BE FREED OF MY SINS. FOR ALL THIS I AM SORRY AND I ASK FOR MERCY THROUGH THE MERITS OF CHRIST'S DEATH. I AM DETERMINED TO DO BETTER. AMEN.

P: God be gracious to you and strengthen your faith. Amen. Do you believe that the pastor's absolution is God's absolution?

C: YES, FOR CHRIST GAVE TO THE HOLY MINISTRY THE POWER TO BIND AND LOOSE SIN ACCORDING TO GOD'S WORD.

P: Then as you believe, so let it be done to you. And I, by the command of Jesus Christ our Lord, forgive you all your sin in the name of the Father, and of the ✠ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. Be at peace.

C: AMEN.

P: Dearest friends in Christ: You know that our Lord Jesus Christ, out of unspeakable love, instituted at the last, this His Supper as a memorial and proclamation of His death suffered for our sins. This commemoration requires a firm faith to make the heart and conscience of everyone who wants to use and partake of this Supper sure and certain that Christ has suffered death for all his or her sins. But whoever doubts and does not in some manner feel such faith should know that the Supper is of no avail to him or her, but will rather be to his or her hurt, and such a one should stay away from it. And since we cannot see such faith and it is known only to God, we

leave it to the conscience of the one who comes and admit all who request and desire the sacrament. But, those who cling to open sins, such as greed, hatred, anger, envy, profiteering, unchastity, and the like and are not minded to renounce them, are hereby barred from the Supper, and are warned faithfully not to come forward lest they incur judgment and damnation for their own souls, as St. Paul says, 1 Corinthians 11:29. If, however, any have fallen because of weakness, and have by word and deed given evidence that they earnestly desire to better themselves, this grace and communion of the Body and Blood of Christ is not denied to them. In this fashion each must judge him or herself and look out for him or herself. For God is not mocked, nor will He give that which is holy to the dogs or cast pearls before swine.
