Grace to you, and peace, from Him Who was, Who is, and Who is to come, even Christ the Lord! Amen.

Again it is time to begin a new year in the Christian calendar with the seasons of Advent and Christmas.

Not too long ago the season of Advent was a time for repentance, as men and women sought to prepare their hearts and minds to consider the mystery of Jesus born at Bethlehem, God in human flesh, the Savior hidden under the veil of weakness and humility. And in preparing for the joyful celebration of the first "advent" (literally, "coming") of Christ on earth, men and women in the Church saw that they also needed to be prepared for Jesus' final "advent" at the Last Day. So, a kind of sober spirit of reflection and repentance was encouraged during the weeks leading up to Christmas, as people were turned to consider the "Last Things:"death, judgment, hell, and heaven. Advent also used to be considered a "closed time" in the Church: weddings were delayed, parties were discouraged until the actual Twelve Days of Christmas (December 25 – January 5), and the overall tone of worship was decidedly somber.

But all things change.

However, I would challenge you think about whether a more reflective mood during Advent might not be a healthy counter-balance to the world's frenetic activity at this time of year. Between shopping, parties, having company over, and travel, who isn't exhausted by the time Christmas actually arrives?

During this Advent at Mt. Calvary, we shall again explore a series of mid-week devotions centered on "Making Ready the Way." We will look back to how God prepared the world for Christ's birth, and see what that tells us about being prepared for Christ's return today. And what we will discover is that there is *joy in repentance*. There is a quiet joy in turning away from the sin that warps our lives, and there is an expectant joy in turning towards the life that God pours out upon us in Christ.

So, come, let us prepare to adore Him, and make ready the way. I invite you to step away from the world's hurried hawking of Christmas, and come into our sanctuary to feel the quiet confidence of waiting for what God gives us in Christ as we observe this time of joyful waiting called Advent.
