Pastor's Column

- ¹⁹ Open to me the gates of righteousness,
that I may enter through them
and give thanks to the LORD.
- ²⁰ This is the gate of the LORD;
the righteous shall enter through it.
- ²¹ I thank you that you have answered me
and have become my salvation.
- ²² The stone that the builders rejected
has become the cornerstone.
- ²³ This is the LORD's doing;
it is marvelous in our eyes.
- ²⁴ This is the day that the LORD has made;
let us rejoice and be glad in it.
- (Psalm 118, ESV)

So, as we come to Holy Week and Pascha (Easter), Psalm 118 is a good reminder of what this week is all about.

The psalmist begins with the imperative directed toward the priests at the Temple: "Open the gates!" Why? So that the psalmist can give thanks to YHWH. That's well and good – we certainly ought to go to the house of the Lord to give Him thanks, and no one should bar our access to God's merciful presence.

But this begs the questions, "what is the gate of the Lord?" and, "Who are the righteous?"

It turns out that the gate is not simply the

physical portal that allowed one to enter the Temple. The "gate of the Lord" can also be the path and calling that He has set before a person as they journey toward His purpose for them. The righteous are the faithful. But – Who is faithful like the Lord's Servant? He is the One Who enters into the calling set before Him to do His Father's will. And once we begin to see Jesus here, everything comes together.

For even as Jesus went through the gate that led to His rejection, suffering, and death, He knew that the Father would yet vindicate Him and bring Him salvation. He doesn't seek to save Himself, because He is come to save us. But He trusts the Father to hold Him and bring Him through all that He must endure.

And what does He endure? He is the stone the builders rejected. The authorities, even many of the people, judged Jesus as being worthless, useless for any good thing. It is like when a skilled mason looks at a stone to see whether its composition, size, and stability make it usable or not. Rejected stones are discarded, they are not "re-purposed." And that's what happened to Jesus as He was rejected – and handed over to the Romans, and killed outside the holy city of Jerusalem.

Yet, in that very rejection, Jesus is made the

cornerstone – the stone upon which everything depends – life and salvation. For the Father heard His Son, and made His sacrifice the source of forgiveness. For Jesus' shame and rejection were suffered for us, so that we would not be cast off as worthless. And by His resurrection, Jesus is declared to be the Righteous One Who redeems the whole of the creation.

This – the taking of the rejected stone, and using its rejection to bring salvation to all – is YHWH's doing. For Who but God could do such a thing? Who, but God, would do such a thing? This is marvelous, wondrous, beyond belief. To say that it is "marvelous in our eyes" is to say that every time it is set before us, every time we think about it, we can't help but to laugh a little in stunned joy that God has done this for us. We certainly didn't deserve it.

But *this* is *the day* the Lord has made. At Concordia, every morning starts with Ms. Craine announcing over the speakers, "This is the day the Lord has made." And in response, every classroom shouts, "Let us rejoice and be glad in it." And it is certainly true that every day is the Lord's creation, and that we should rejoice in all that He gives us day by day. **BUT** in this Psalm, *this* refers to the rejected stone being made the cornerstone, and *the day* is when God did that marvelous work. "This is the day the Lord has made" is the day when Christ left the tomb empty, and brought life and salvation to all through His death and resurrection. That is what we rejoice in.

So, join us for Holy Week, the Vigil, and the Divine Service of Pascha (Easter Day). For because of this, you can join the psalmist, and Jesus, in saying to YHWH: "I thank You that You have answered me, and have become my salvation."

The butterfly reminds us of new life and the Resurrection. After three days, Jesus rose from the dead and brings us the hope of new beginnings. This simple craft helps children celebrate that joyful truth.

What you need:

- Light-colored construction paper
- Card stock
- Glue
- Paint
- Paintbrush
- Paper towel or baby wipe



What you do:

- Cut out a butterfly body from the construction paper.
- Glue the butterfly body onto the card stock.
- Use a paintbrush to coat the palm of one hand with paint.
- Press your painted hand beside the butterfly body to create a wing.
- Repeat with your other hand to make the second wing.
- Clean your hands with a paper towel or baby wipe.
- Optional: Add Luke 24:5-6 (NIV) around the butterfly or on its body:

"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!"

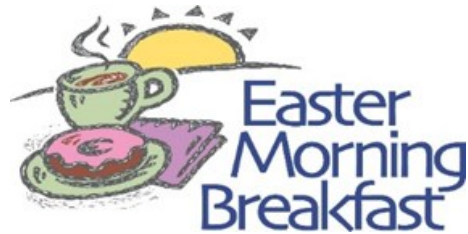
CURRENT BIBLE STUDY TOPICS
