Pastor's Column

¹⁵When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." ¹⁶So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died: ¹⁷'Say to Joseph, "Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you.'" And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants." ¹⁹But Joseph said to them, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? ²⁰As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. ²¹So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones." Thus, he comforted them and spoke kindly to them. Genesis 50:15-21, ESV

In many ways, this can be seen as the climax of the Book of Genesis – the tribes of Israel being preserved to carry forward the promise of the Messiah. But more than that, it is Joseph's handing on of the mercy that he had received, and his bold declaration of YHWH's ability to take evil and use it to bring about the good, that set before us a call to live confi-

dently as God's people in the midst of a broken world.

Many of you are familiar with the history of Joseph and his brothers. Joseph, for his part, began his life having a little problem with arrogance. He was his father's favorite, and he knew it. And not only did he revel in it, he made sure his brothers didn't forget it. Joseph's brothers, on the other hand, resented Joseph with a murderous envy that stretches back to Cain. Anyway, they got rid of him – selling him off to traders headed for Egypt. They let their father Jacob suffer thinking his son was dead.

And through a series of what seem misadventures, Joseph ends up second to Pharaoh. And Joseph learned humility. He had been falsely accused. Imprisoned. He had learned the gravity of his gift in interpreting dreams: God did not give him such knowledge so that he could puff himself up. His gift was a matter of life and death – as he and Pharaoh's servants discovered in prison. It is not an easy thing to tell a man that he will certainly die. Joseph had learned what it was to be forgotten by the powerful of this world, even as he knew he was remembered by God.

And then his brothers showed up, seeking relief from the famine. Joseph did not choose the way of vengeance. He used his power and position to bring his brothers to repentance and faith. And all seemed well.

Until Jacob died.

And then the brothers' weak faith, guilt, and fear, overwhelmed them. Had Joseph only been playing at mercy? With Jacob gone, would Joseph now take his revenge?

Obviously, the answer was, "no." But the brothers still didn't understand the ways of God. They feared the old adage, "turn about is fair play." In fact, the Hebrew at verse 15 is more literally translated: "suppose he is holding a grudge against us, and reversing, will reverse to us all the evil we did to him?"

But Joseph was not the same person they had grown up with. He had come to know two things on the path YHWH brought him through. One: he learned he is not God. I know that seems pretty obvious. But in our old nature, we often assume to be in control in places where we have not been given charge. We are not in the place of God. It is not for us, in our ordinary callings, to presume to visit justice upon those who have wronged us. God has established a variety of orders to uphold justice, and we are called to respect them. Now, if you are called to the civil magistrate, then yes, you will be called to pass judgment – but not for yourself – for the community. If you are a parent, you are called to pass judgment to raise your child to know right from wrong – but again, not for yourself but for her or his well-being.

And Joseph had come to see that God can use even what is evil to bring about what is good. That is how wondrous He is. Who would have guessed that a despised brother imprisoned in Egypt would be the means by which God provided for His people to grow and flourish? Remember: Jacob's family went down to Egypt being seventy in number, and when Moses led them out of Egypt they were likely two million and more in number.

And because we are not God, and know that God can do all things – including using evil to bring forth good (after all, think of the evil

that was done to Jesus and how God used that to redeem all of a fallen humanity) – we can hand on mercy to those around us. We don't have to get even. We don't have to teach folks a lesson. We can trust God to be God, and simply look after our callings in grace and peace.

COOKIE SMILE POPS

Transform slice-and-bake cookies into cheerful lollipop treats and share a few edible smiles.

What you need:

- 1 roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough
- Knife
- Baking sheet
- Wooden craft sticks
- Frosting
- Sprinkles
- Clear treat bags
- Ribbon

What you do:

1. Freeze the cookie dough for 15 to 20 minutes to firm it up, then slice into ¼-inch rounds.
2. Place cookies on a baking sheet about 2 inches apart.
3. Bake at 350 degrees for 5 minutes.
4. Remove from the oven and gently press a wooden stick halfway into the bottom of each cookie.
5. Return to the oven and bake 3 to 5 more minutes, until lightly golden.
6. Let cookies cool completely.
7. Decorate with frosting to create smiling faces and add sprinkles.
8. Slip each cookie pop into a treat bag and tie with ribbon.

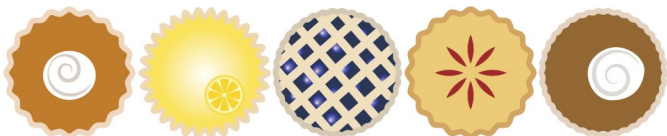

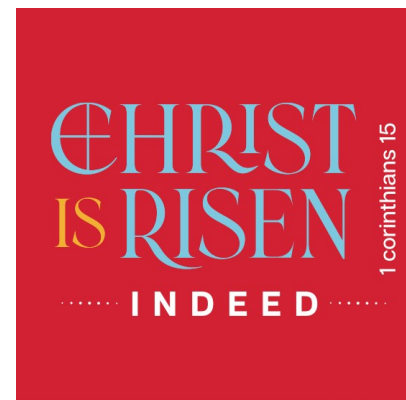
CHRIST IS RISEN; TELL THE NEXT GENERATION

During a convention year, the LCMS gathers a National Offering. This year the offering will support "making the Good News of Jesus Christ among families."
