Pastor's Column

Psalm 121

- ¹ I lift up my eyes to the hills.
From where does my help come?
- ² My help comes from the LORD,
Who made heaven and earth.
- ³ He will not let your foot be moved;
He who keeps you will not slumber.
- ⁴ Behold, He who keeps Israel
will neither slumber nor sleep.
- ⁵ The LORD is your keeper;
the LORD is your shade on your right hand.
- ⁶ The sun shall not strike you by day,
nor the moon by night.
- ⁷ The LORD will keep you from all evil;
He will keep your life.
- ⁸ The LORD will keep
your going out and your coming in
from this time forth and forevermore.
(*English Standard Version*)

Here's another one of my favorite psalms to share during visits. And the reason for that is easy enough to see: the Psalmist's confidence that YHWH (the Lord God) will help, that He is watching, is guarding and is preserving, is practically infectious. And when we are in a difficult place, this assurance is exactly what we need.

Now it turns out that the English here cap-

tures the Hebrew pretty well – so I don't have any startling insights to offer by way of correcting the translation. However, I do want to offer you a couple of things to chew on as you meditate upon this Scripture.

In the Hebrew, the psalm includes a "superscription." There are debates as to whether these were original to the psalms, or added by later "editors." I'll spare you the discussion. But, for Psalm 121, it is part of a group of psalms (120-134) that all have the superscription "Song of Ascents." Scholars believe that means these psalms were used by pilgrims going to Jerusalem. Whether they were inspired on other occasions, and then later roped into that particular service, we just don't know.

The reason they were called "Songs of Ascent" was because Jewish piety always looked to Jerusalem, and the Temple, as the "highest place." Your actual change in elevation when you went to God's city wasn't the issue. When you went to the place where He promised to be found, you were always "going up."

And suddenly the opening of this psalm comes to life. I'm not lifting up my eyes to any old hill – I'm looking up to the "Holy Hill" where I will worship in YHWH's presence. Because He has promised to be found there, I know from whence my help comes.

And as I make my way toward Him, what does He promise? He won't let your foot slip, He won't fall asleep on you, He won't let the elements destroy you, He will keep your life. In other words, as you join the pilgrims in their journey to YHWH and His Holy City, He will make sure that you get there. "Your going out" refers to the beginning of your journey, and "your coming in" refers to your arrival at His House.

Now, today the Temple is no longer standing. But we know that we have been grafted into the Israel of faith, and that YHWH is now found fully in His Son, Jesus our Lord. And where to do find Jesus? In His Word, in His Sacraments, among His People. In other words, in His Church.

And Jesus is indeed the "help" that comes from YHWH – for He is the One Who has redeemed us and Who gives us new and everlasting life.

Which means that as we come to worship, this "song of ascent" can be sung by us as we leave our homes, and head to church. "I lift up my eyes...."

Thursday Lunch Together and Bible Study: We're reading the Gospel according to St. Luke. 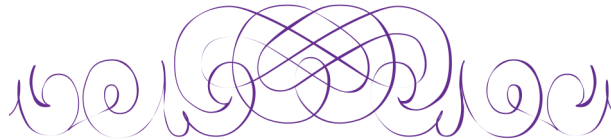

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A sweet reminder that God is always growing something new, no matter the season. As summer winds down and a new school year begins, remember He is at work in your life, helping you grow in faith, kindness and courage. With His help, you can grow in wisdom, build friendships and shine His love wherever you go.

What you need:

- 2 cups milk
- 1 (4-serving) box chocolate instant pudding mix
- 1 (8 oz.) tub whipped topping, thawed
- 1 (16 oz.) package Oreo cookies, crushed
- 8 (9 oz.) clear plastic cups
- Gummy worms or frogs (optional)



What you do:

1. In a large bowl, whisk together milk and pudding mix for 2 minutes. Let stand for 5 minutes until thickened.
2. Gently fold in the whipped topping.
3. Add a layer of crushed cookies to the bottom of each cup.
4. Spoon pudding mixture on top, filling the cups about ¾ full.
5. Sprinkle more crushed cookies on top to look like "dirt."
6. Add gummy worms or frogs for fun.
7. Chill until ready to serve, or enjoy right away.

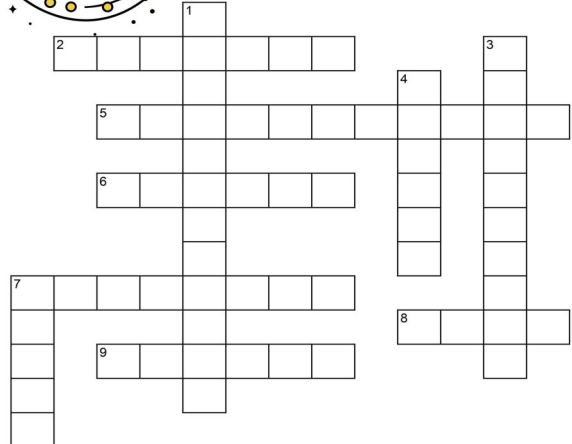
