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Pastor's Column

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to His great mercy, He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, ⁴to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, ⁵who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. ⁶In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, ⁷so that the tested genuineness of your faith – more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire – may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ. ⁸Though you have not seen Him, you love Him. Though you do not now see Him, you believe in Him and rejoice with joy that is inexpressible and filled with glory, ⁹obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls. 1 Peter 1:3-9 (English Standard Version)

Here's another passage I like to share during visits. And I hope the reason is fairly easy to see – Peter is simply overflowing with confidence and joy because he knows Christ is raised. And that joy and confidence is ours as well.

So, look at how Peter is inspired to start: God the Father has caused us to be born again to a living hope. The word for “born again” more literally means to be generated again. That is,

our new birth is essentially a start over from the beginning, not a reconditioning. We have been, and are being, made over from scratch. Why? Because what we were born of from Adam's line was hopelessly lost. There were not, and are not, enough “patches” in all of creation to make our old self work as it should. The old nature could “hope” to be better someday, but that hope would never see the light of day. We were, and are, too broken.

But the new generation of us has a “living hope” – meaning a hope that will come to pass, and which even now gives us life and a certain liveliness. And note that it all ties to Jesus' resurrection. Because He is raised, He has new life for us. Because He is raised, we know the hope set before us will come to pass. Because He lives, we have life.

Now, we don't yet have the fullness of that life, and we struggle in the midst of much doubt and weakness – but that inheritance is there, and it is being safe-guarded for us even now. Notice again how Peter is moved to write – he uses three Greek words that might be better rendered as “*not*-decaying, *not*-soiled, *not*-fading (away).” What has come to pass in Jesus cannot be undone – that is why our hope is lively. Jesus' work to give us new life doesn't fade away, the world cannot make it un-wholesome, and it does not lose its power or promise over time.

Your inheritance in Christ is being kept safe, and you are being kept safe as well. You are be-

ing kept by faith. That is, the faith the Holy Spirit works in your heart through the Word is what keeps you in the life Christ gives you. Now, in this present hour, the fullness of salvation is not yet present to us – it waits to be revealed, or uncovered, to us at the “last time.” And that phrase can be more literally rendered as: “at the right time, the end.” While the world lives in fear of the “end,” we actually look forward to it, for we know that when it comes, we will see the fullness of the new creation and the restoration of all things – ourselves included.

And if this is what we know is coming, it completely changes how we experience the trials of this life. The troubles and hurts, the tragedies and injustices, the afflictions we endure – none of these changes a thing about our future. Christ is still raised. The hope is still lively.

And because we are given to know Christ as He comes to us, we are given to love Him, and trust in Him. And that will lead us to the “outcome” of our faith. The Greek is actually says to “the end of our faith” – meaning that we finally arrive at the terminal that faith was always moving toward. It’s not the end of our faith, or trusting in God, think of it as the end of a journey. Because Christ is raised, because we are generated anew in Him, we are destined for the complete salvation of our souls – which is nothing less than the whole of our lives. This is a lively hope, indeed.

And when we are in the midst of a hard go at it, this is an important passage to bring to mind, and to heart. Your salvation is ready, and you are being kept ready for it. Blessed be God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! Amen.

Give Thanks with Music



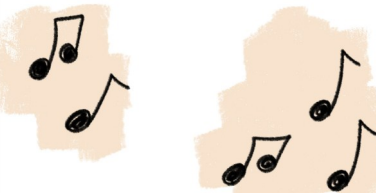
What you need:

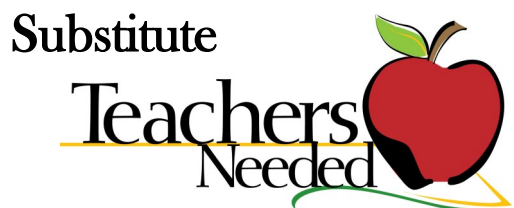
